

Supplemental report of the PPP rules committee
June 4, 2020

The rules committee met on June 4, 2020 to address two challenges forwarded to us by Rachel Hunsucker.

The first challenge indicated a concern regarding the credentials process. It appeared from the face and the body of the document that the challenge would be best addressed by the credentials committee. The rules committee did not find anywhere in the constitution or bylaws where the committee has jurisdiction to address the concerns raised, and are deferring this to the credentials committee. We believe this would be the proper body for any credentials challenge.

The second challenge indicated a question regarding ballots. Again, we do not feel that we have jurisdiction to address challenges however we would note that persons with ballot issues are able to address those in advance of the convention pursuant to Rule 6 of the Oklahoma PPP. . We spoke with the executive director today and he indicated that they would make several announcements during the convention that if anybody had a ballot issue they could contact the convention in progress so that assistance can be made so that their ballot is properly received, corrected and registered.

In addition, we understand the duty of the party to meet the affirmative action goals in order to have the delegation seated properly by the DNC. And while it would have been preferred for these affirmative action codes to be listed on the ballot, there is no requirement that ballots include the information. We do recognize the delegation must meet the affirmative action goals to be seated at the national convention.
