

39 Oklahoma state lawmakers, all Republicans, signed letters in December 2020 urging Congress to challenge the certification of the presidential election. The effort failed, but not before a pro-Trump mob stormed the Capitol that ended up leaving five dead, including a U.S. Capitol police officer.
